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1 Hosts

1.1 What Are the Troubleshooting Methods for Host and Proxy Connectivity Verification Failures

Host connectivity verification failures can be handled by the following host types:

- Linux Hosts
- Self-Hosted Resource Pool
- Windows Hosts
- Cloud Hosts

Linux Hosts

- **Step 1** Verify whether the IP address, username, and password are correct.
- **Step 2** Check whether the port enabled on the target host is an SSH port (port **22** by default).

How to enable the port:

- Enable the firewall.
 systemctl start firewalld.service
 systemctl stop firewalld.service #Disable the firewall.
- 2. Enable the port.

firewall-cmd --zone=public --add-port=22/tcp --permanent

□ NOTE

- --zone #Application zone.
- --add-port=22/tcp #Port, in the format of port number/communication protocol.
- --permanent #Takes effect permanently. If this parameter does not exist, it becomes invalid after the system is restarted.
- 3. Restart the firewall. firewall-cmd --reload
- **Step 3** Check the network status.

Run the **tcpdump** command to check the network connection.

tcpdump -n "tcp port 22 and host xxx.xxx.xxx" #This command is executed on the local PC to check whether the execution host is connected. xxx.xxx.xxx indicates the public IP address of CodeArts Deploy.

#Or

tcpdump -n "tcp port 22" | grep -v "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx" #This command is executed on the local PC to check whether the host is connected. xxx.xxx.xxx indicates the IP address of the target host.

If no command output is displayed, the network connection is normal.

Step 4 Choose **Settings** > **General** > **Basic Resources** from the main menu. Click the cluster name to go to its details page. In the host list, verify the target host connectivity and check whether the server has established SSH connections to this host. The following information indicates that the server has established SSH connections to this host.

Cause analysis:

- SSH connections exist between the server and the target host.
 - The target host is not configured properly or tcpdump is not installed. Perform the following operations to check the host configurations:
 - For details, see Configuring the IP Address Blacklist and Whitelist in the User Guide.
 - Run the following command to check whether a firewall is configured (iptables is used as an example): iptables -L
- No SSH connections exist between the server and the target host.

The target host is unreachable because the network may have access restrictions.

Check whether the source and destination IP addresses are restricted by the firewall, and check the SSH protocol configurations.

Step 5 Check permissions on the SSH key file.

Log in to the host as the **root** user and run the following commands to check permissions on the SSH key file:

```
cd /root/.ssh
```

Check whether the file permission is **rw**.

If the file permission is incorrect, run the following command to modify it:

chmod 600 File name.

- **Step 6** Check the operations on the **\${HOME}** directory. If the user who carries the host connectivity verification fails to operate the **\${HOME}** directory, do as follows:
 - 1. Check whether the disk where the **\${HOME}** directory of the host is located is full.
 - Run the df -h command to check whether the disk where the \${HOME} directory is located is full.
 - Run the ll -ld \${HOME} and lsattr -d \${HOME} commands to check the
 permission setting and hidden attributes of the \${HOME} directory of the
 user.
 - 2. Check whether the user has the read and write permissions on the **\${HOME}** directory.
 - Run the **chmod** and **chattr** commands to grant the user the permissions required to read from and write into the **\${HOME}** directory.
 - 3. Check whether the user's default shell is set to nologin mode.
 - Run the grep username /etc/passwd command. Replace "username" with the actual user name to be checked.
 - In the file, if /usr/sbin/nologin or /sbin/nologin is displayed in the shell column of a user, the user is set to the nologin mode.
 - If the user is in nologin mode, run the sudo usermod -s /bin/bash username command to allow the user to log in. Replace "username" with the actual user name.
- **Step 7** If the connectivity test of a proxy associated with a host fails or an error message indicating that the host connection timed out, locate the fault by performing the following operations.
 - 1. Test the connectivity of the proxy host.
 - 2. Run the following command to check whether **AllowTcpForwarding** has been enabled for SSH on the proxy host:

 grep "AllowTcpForwarding" /etc/ssh/sshd_config

```
[root@ubuntu-ldf ~]# grep "AllowTcpForwarding" /etc/ssh/sshd_config AllowTcpForwarding yes
```


If the value is **no**, set it to **yes** and run the following command to restart the sshd service:

service sshd restart

----End

Self-Hosted Resource Pool

- **Step 1** Check whether the agent pool of the host cluster to which the host belongs is available.
 - 1. Click the name of the host cluster. On the host cluster details page that is displayed, click **Manage Resource Pools**.



- 2. Go to the **Agent Pool** page and check the status.
 - If the status is Offline, delete the agent and reinstall it.



 If the status is **Disabled**, enable the agent in the **Operation** column and verify the connectivity again.



Step 2 Click **Connectivity Verification Result**. If a script execution error is displayed, perform the following operations to troubleshoot it. (If no script execution error is displayed, skip this step.)

Cause analysis:

The self-hosted resource pool needs to use Docker to pull images. The script execution error occurs because Docker is not installed in the self-hosted resource pool or cannot be used properly. You can perform the following operations to troubleshoot the error:

Troubleshooting method

1. Run the following command to check whether Docker is installed: docker --version

```

If the version number is displayed in the command output, Docker has been installed.

If no version number is displayed in the command output, Docker is not installed.

∩ NOTE

If Docker is not installed, install it by referring to Installing/Uninstalling Docker, and then perform the following operations to verify the connectivity:

- 1. Go to the **Services** page, click **Deploy**, and then click the target application name to access the target project.
- 2. Choose **Settings > General > Basic Resources**. The **Host Clusters** page is displayed by default.
- 3. Click the name of the target cluster. On the cluster details page that is displayed, click **Proxy Hosts** or **Target Host**.
- 4. Click in the same row as the host, and modify the host information to verify the host again in the dialog box displayed.
- Run the following command to check whether Docker can be used properly: docker images



If the preceding information is displayed, Docker can be used properly. Otherwise, you need to uninstall Docker, and reinstall it by referring to Installing/Uninstalling Docker.

Windows Hosts


- **Step 1** Verify whether the IP address, username, and password are correct.
- **Step 2** Configure a proxy host. For details, see **Configuring a Proxy Host** in the *User Guide*.
- **Step 3** Enable the WinRM function. For details, see **Configuring a Target Host** in the *User Guide*.

Step 4 Run the following command on PowerShell to check whether the WinRM function has been enabled:

Step 5 Check whether the Windows firewall allows external hosts to access the WinRM service.



----End

Cloud Hosts

Locate the fault in the same way as you would do for a Windows or Linux host. Configure the security group for the cloud host to allow access from the public IP addresses of CodeArts Deploy. (For details, see **Prerequisites for Creating a Host Cluster** in the *User Guide*.)

1.2 What Should I Do If Application Deployment Fails with "tomcat | Download War in url path" Displayed in Logs?

Symptom 1

Application deployment fails, the log information shows tomcat | Download War in url path, and the stderr line displays curl: option --tlsv1.2: is unknown\ncurl: try 'curl --help' or 'curl --manual' for more information.

Cause Analysis

The software package fails to be downloaded due to an incorrect **curl** version.

The problem often occurs on new hosts, because new hosts usually use the same image to install OSs, and the **curl** may not be the latest version.

Solution

Log in to the cloud host, run the **yum update curl** -**y** command to update the **curl**, and then deploy the application again.

Symptom 2

Application deployment fails, the log information shows **tomcat | Download War in url path**, and the **stderr** line displays **getaddrinfo(3) failed for XXXX.com:443\n**.

Cause Analysis

The software package cannot be downloaded because the cloud host cannot connect to the CodeArts Build.

Solution

Log in to the cloud host, and run the **ping** or **traceroute** command to check whether the host can connect to the domain name of CodeArts Build mentioned in the **stderr** line and the domain names and IP addresses of Baidu or Google.

- 1. If both the domain names and IP addresses cannot be connected, the cloud host does not have access to the Internet.
- 2. If the IP addresses can be connected but domain names cannot, there is something wrong with domain name resolution. Modify the /etc/resolv.conf file on the host, as shown in following figure.

3. If only the CodeArts Build cannot be connected, the CodeArts Build may be faulty.

1.3 Why Does a Task Fail on an Ubuntu Host After Being Successfully Run on a CentOS Host?

Symptoms

The following log information is displayed.

Cause Analysis

By default, CentOS uses **bash** and Ubuntu OS uses **dash**. **Bash** and **dash** are incompatible with each other. In CodeArts Deploy, the default script generated can only run on a host that uses **bash**. Therefore, an error will be reported if the script is run on an Ubuntu host.

Solution

Log in to the target host, run the **sudo dpkg-reconfigure dash** command, and select **no** to switch the shell of the Ubuntu OS to bash.

1.4 What Should I Do If the No Host or Environment Whose Connectivity Has Been Verified?

Symptoms

A pipeline or an application mounted to a pipeline failed to run, and an error message is displayed, indicating that no host or environment whose connectivity has been verified.

Cause Analysis

The host configured for the application has been deleted or failed to be verified for the connectivity.

Solution

Go to the **Deploy** page, click the target application name, and switch to the **Environment Management** page to click the environment name. In the displayed dialog box, switch to the **Resources** page to search for the host, and check its connectivity verification status.

Choose either of the following methods based on the host status:

• If the host exists but fails to be verified for its connectivity, modify the host information and verify the host again by performing the following steps:

- a. Access the target project.
 - Choose Settings > General > Basic Resources. The Host Clusters page is displayed by default.
 - Choose CICD > Deploy. Click Basic Resources. The Host Clusters page is displayed by default.
- b. Click the name of the target cluster. On the cluster details page that is displayed, click **Proxy Hosts** or **Target Host**.
- c. Click in the same row as the host, and modify the host information to verify the host again in the dialog box displayed.
- d. After the modification, click **Save**. The host list page is displayed.
- If the host does not exist, add a host for the application and ensure that the host has been verified for its connectivity.

1.5 What Are Possible Causes of a Host verification failure?

If connectivity verification fails for a host, check the following items:

- 1. Username and password.
- 2. Startup status.
- 3. Ports: Check that ports on the host have been enabled.
- 4. Firewall policy: Run the **iptables -L -n** command to check whether access over port **22** is restricted.
- 5. The IP address must be accessible from the public network. If you are using a private IP address, an SSH proxy is required.
- 6. CentOS version: If the host is running CentOS, ensure that the CentOS version is 6.0 or later.
- 7. Windows version: If the host is running Windows, ensure that the Windows version is supported by CodeArts Deploy and you have configured the host. For details, see **Configuring a Host** in the *User Guide*.

2 Application Deployment

2.1 What Should I Do If a Draft Application Cannot Be Deployed?

Symptoms

During application deployment, a message is displayed, indicating that CodeArts Deploy cannot deploy draft applications.

Cause Analysis

An application in draft state cannot be called by the pipeline.

Solution

- 1. On the CodeArts Deploy homepage, click in the same row as the target application and click **Edit**.
- 2. Click **Save**. The application will change from the draft state to the pending state and can be called by the pipeline.

2.2 What Are Error Messages Displayed During Application Deployment?

The following table describes the error messages that may be displayed if application deployment fails.

Error Message	Description
The host ip is invalid, Please check	The host is unavailable, or the host IP address cannot be 127.0.0.1 or localhost .

Error Message	Description
[group_vars/all] is not found, Please check	The [group_vars/all] file is not found. Check whether the directory of the entry file contains the [group_vars/all] file.
The parameter value is invalid, Please check!	The parameter value can contain only ASCII characters, except {{, {%, or {#. or contain only letters, digits, and underscores (_).

2.3 How Do I Find the Cause of an Application Deployment Error in Logs?

View the logs from the bottom to top, and find the statement containing **FAILED**.

- The previous line of the **FAILED** statement indicates the action in which application deployment fails.
- View the lines after the **FAILED** statement, and find the **stderr** line. This line contains the script execution output and the description of the cause.

2.4 What Should I Do If Error 403 Displayed During Application Deployment That Requires CCE Resources, Indicating Insufficient Permission?

Symptoms

- 1. When the CCE API is called during application deployment or pipeline deployment, error 403 and the message **Policy doesn't allow cce:cluster:get tb performed** are displayed.
- 2. The error message **The IAM user is not authorized to access the API** is displayed when the pipeline runs a Kubernetes application.

Cause Analysis

You do not have permissions to view and execute CCE deployment.

Solution

Use an account with the required CCE permissions and delegate your AK ID/SK to the account used for application deployment. The following uses the Kubernetes application as an example.

- **Step 1** Edit the application, select **Authorized User**, and create an authorized IAM user.
- Step 2 In the displayed Create Service Endpoint: IAM User dialog box, enter the AK/SK of the account authorized to deploy CCE. For details about how to create a service endpoint, see "Creating an IAM Account Service Endpoint".

- **Step 3** Use the new service endpoint and save the task.
- **Step 4** Choose **Settings** > **General** > **Service Permissions** of the current project, and switch to the **Permissions** tab page.
- **Step 5** Select the role to which the account for deploying the application belongs, expand **DevMarket**, click **Edit** and enable the **read** permission.

2.5 How Do I Roll Back a Deployed Version?

Symptoms

This section describes how to roll back a version on CodeArts Deploy.

Guideline

In the application deployment records, select the application whose version you want to roll back.

Procedure

- **Step 1** Click the target application name in the application list. The application deployment records are displayed.
- **Step 2** Select the target version and click **Roll Back to This Version**. In the displayed dialog box, click **OK**.

----End



If the **Build No.** in the deployment source is **Latest**, you need to manually modify the build number. (The same applies to software packages.)

2.6 What Should I Do If an Application Deployment Times Out?

Symptoms

An application fails to be deployed, and the log information **Task execution timed out. Stop the task. Start time:** *******, **end time:** ******* is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The maximum duration for deploying an application at a time is 30 minutes. If the duration exceeds 30 minutes, the application fails to be deployed.

Solution

- If application deployment times out due to too many deployment steps, split the application into multiple applications and deploy them in sequence.
- If application deployment times out due to synchronous waiting (for example, waiting for action **Run Shell Commands**), run a command to change the execution mode to asynchronous.

2.7 Does CodeArts Deploy Provide Batch and Incremental Deployment Policies?

No. CodeArts Deploy does not provide any deployment policies. However, you can configure relevant settings to achieve different deployment purposes. For example:


- 1. Batch deployment: When configuring hosts for an application, you can select multiple hosts as the target host.
- 2. Incremental deployment: Add actions or disable one or more actions.

2.8 Do I Need to Upload a Software Package to CodeArts Artifact Before Deployment?

Not necessarily. The software package can be downloaded from CodeArts Artifact or using a build task. Therefore, you can select a file in CodeArts Artifact or use the output of a build task for deployment..

Set Deployment Source to Artifact

- **Step 1** In the action **Select Deployment Source**, set **Source** to **Artifact**, and click on the right of **Software Package**.
- **Step 2** In the **Select File** dialog box displayed, select the target software package downloaded from CodeArts Artifact.
 - For a software package in the folder format, all files in the folder are downloaded by default in the action **Select Deployment Source**.
 - For a software package in the file format, the file is downloaded by default in the action **Select Deployment Source**.



----End

Setting the Source to Build Task

- **Step 1** In the action **Select Deployment Source**, set **Source** to **Build task**.
- **Step 2** Click the **Build Task** drop-down list box. All build tasks under the current project are displayed.

Step 3 Select **Artifact Source** drop-down list box.

Step 4 Set **Build No.** You need to create a build task and then select a build No.

Step 5 After application deployment, download the software package generated based on the build record to the specified path on the target host.

2.9 Can I Deploy Web Pages Written in HTML or JS?

Yes. Package the local project code and deploy the project using CodeArts Deploy.

If you want E2E build and deployment, use Java Web Demo provided in the code repository to upload the code to the cloud repository, and then use Maven to build and package the code, and use Tomcat scripts for deployment.

2.10 How Do I Upload an Image for Container Deployment?

There are two image sources:

- Source 1: Container images generated using CodeArts Build. These images will be automatically uploaded to SWR once generated.
- Source 2: Local images uploaded to SWR.

During container deployment, you can select an image only from SWR.

3 Common FAQs

3.1 Can I Use a Host to Deploy Multiple Projects?

Yes.

After you add and verify a host, the host can be found in all projects of the account. To deploy multiple projects on a host, configure different installation paths and listening ports to prevent the projects from overwriting each other.

3.2 Do I Need to Install a Running Environment (Tomcat, Python, etc.) on the Target Host Before Deploying an Application?

No. Only Python needs to be installed before template-based deployment. Other running environments, such as Tomcat and JDK, can be added by adding application actions.

3.3 What Should I Do If Application Deployment Fails, with the Message "AnsibleUndefinedVariable: 'xxxx' is undefined" Displayed?

Cause Analysis

The xxxx parameter is not configured in the custom parameters of the application.

Solution

Check whether the xxxx parameter is configured for the application that fails to be deployed.

• If this parameter is not configured, create the custom parameter xxxx.

• If this parameter has been configured, contact technical support.

3.4 What Should I Do If Application Deployment Succeeds But the Application Verification URL Cannot Be Accessed?

Cause Analysis

Check whether the host has an inbound rule of SSH, HTTP, or HTTPS access for the IP address of the application by referring to **Prerequisites for Creating a Host Cluster** in the *User Guide*.

Solution

If the host does not have such a rule, add one and open the verification path URL again.

3.5 What Should I Do If Application Deployment Fails Due to a DNS Resolution Error?

The error occurs because **bind-utils** is not installed on the host. Run the **yum install bind-utils** command on the host to install **bind-utils**.

3.6 What Should I Do If a Draft Application Cannot Be Deployed?

Symptoms

During application deployment, a message is displayed, indicating that CodeArts Deploy cannot deploy draft applications.

Cause Analysis

An application in draft state cannot be called by the pipeline.

Solution

- 1. On the CodeArts Deploy homepage, click in the same row as the target application and click **Edit**.
- 2. Click **Save**. The application will change from the draft state to the pending state and can be called by the pipeline.

3.7 What Should I Do If JDK Has Been Installed and Environment Variables Have Been Configured, But Application Deployment Fails with the Error Message "please configure JDK environment variables" Displayed?

Symptoms

JDK has been installed and environment variables have been configured. But application deployment fails with the error message **please configure JDK environment variables** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

Environment variables are not configured in the \$HOME/.bashrc and \$HOME/.bash_profile files.

Solution

Add the following code segment to the end of the **\$HOME/.bashrc** and **\$HOME/.bash_profile** files:

export JAVA_HOME=/usr/local/java/jdk1.8.0_144 export JRE_HOME=/usr/local/java/jdk1.8.0_144/jre export CLASSPATH=::\$JAVA_HOME/lib/dt.jar:\$JAVA_HOME/lib/tools.jar:\$JAVA_HOME/lib:\$CLASSPATH export PATH=\$JAVA_HOME/bin:\$PATH

3.8 What Should I Do If the Log Indicates Insufficient Permissions?

Symptoms

When a host-related application is deployed, and the error message "insufficient permissions" is displayed, you do not have permissions to access the current file or folder.

Cause Analysis

You do not have permissions to access the current file or folder.

Solution

- Switch to other files that you have permissions to access.
- Use a user account with higher permissions, for example, root.
- Grant higher permissions to the user account you are using. For example, to grant all permissions to a user account, add 'user ALL=(ALL) ALL' to the /etc/sudoers file. user indicates a user account.

3.9 What Should I Do If the Path Is Invalid?

Symptoms

The log information prompts an invalid path.

Cause Analysis

The entered path is invalid.

Solution

Check the path and ensure that the path does not contain backslashes (\).

3.10 What Should I Do If the System Displays a Message Indicating That No Hosts Are Found in the Environment?

Symptoms

No hosts are found in the environment.

Cause Analysis

The environment does not contain any hosts.

Solution

- **Step 1** Select the target application, click , and click **Edit**. The **Deployment Actions** page is displayed.
- **Step 2** Click the **Environment Management** tab.
- **Step 3** Click the target environment name, switch to the **Resources** page, and click **Import Host**.
- **Step 4** After the host is added and verified, deploy the application again.

----End

3.11 What Should I Do If an Error Is Reported When the Sudo Permission Is Used?

Symptoms

A password is required after **Run this task with sudo privileges** is selected during the deployment of a host-related application.

Cause Analysis

You have selected **Run this task with sudo privileges**, but password-free settings have not been configured in the **/etc/sudoers** file on the Linux host.

Solution

In the /etc/sudoers file, add \$username ALL=(ALL) NOPASSWD: ALL after root ALL=(ALL:ALL) ALL. \$username indicates a username.

3.12 What Should I Do If the File or File Path Does Not Exist?

Symptoms

The error message **The file or file path does not exist** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The possible causes are as follows:

- The file does not exist.
- The file path is not an absolute path.

Solution

Perform the following operations based on the failure causes:

- Run the shell command to check whether the source file exists.
- Check whether the file path is an absolute path starting with a forward slash (/).

3.13 What Should I Do If I Have Insufficient Permissions?

"msg": "chown failed: [Errno 1] Operation not permitted: '/home'"

Symptoms

The error message "msg": "chown failed: [Errno 1] Operation not permitted: '/ home'" is displayed.

You do not have permissions to perform this operation.

Solution

Enable the sudo permission or modify the permission of the directory file.

User is not Administrator

Symptoms

During the deployment of the action **Copy Files**, when files are copied across hosts, the error message **User is not Administrator** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The administrator account is not used to log in to the target host.

Solution

Log in to the host using the administrator account.

3.14 What Should I Do If the File Path Does Not Exist?

Symptoms

An error message is displayed, indicating that the file path does not exist.

Cause Analysis

The entered configuration file path does not exist.

Solution

Enter a correct file path.

3.15 What Should I Do If the Action "Create and Start Container" Fails on Ubuntu 22 OS When Using Template "Deploy a Docker Application for Linux"?

Symptoms

The action "Create and Start Container" fails on Ubuntu 22 OS when using template "Deploy a Docker Application for Linux".

cgroups: cgroup mountpoint does not exist: unknown

The Linux kernel version is incompatible with the Docker version.

Solution

You can manually mount the cgroup file to temporarily solve the problem. sudo mkdir /sys/fs/cgroup/systemd sudo mount -t cgroup -o none,name=systemd cgroup /sys/fs/cgroup/systemd

3.16 What Should I Do If the Connection Times Out Occasionally During a Deployment on a Windows Host?

Symptoms

During a deployment on a Windows host, the "Connection to ***.***.*** timed out." message is occasionally displayed.




Cause Analysis

Possible cause:

4.2 Selecting Deployment Sources

4.2.1 Software Package Not Found in CodeArts Artifact

Symptoms

An error message is displayed, indicating that a file path does not exist.

Cause Analysis

The possible causes are as follows:

- The software package does not exist in CodeArts Artifact or has been deleted.
- The **filename** value corresponding to the **demo** parameter in the software package path is incorrect.

Solution

- 1. Go to CodeArts Artifact of the current project and search for the target software package. If it does not exist, add it.
- 2. Search for the software package corresponding to the value referenced by the **\${demo}** parameter. If it does not exist, add it.
- 3. Redeploy the application.

4.2.2 No Software Package Available for a Build Task

Symptoms

An error message is displayed, indicating that a file path does not exist.

Cause Analysis

The build task does not exist, or no software package is defined in the build task.

Solution

Go to the build service of the current project.

- Check whether the current build task exists. If not, create one, build the software package, and deploy the action.
- Check whether the software package exists in the build task. If not, rebuild the software package and deploy the step.

4.2.3 URL Domain Name Resolution Failure

Symptoms

The error message **urlopen error [Errno -2] Name or service not known** is displayed.

Your host fails to resolve the domain name of the release repository. As a result, the file fails to be downloaded.

Solution

If you have a DNS server, you can add the following domain names to the DNS server to resolve the domain names of the release repository:

4.2.5 Inconsistent SHA256 Values in a File

Symptoms

During file download, the error message **File sha256 different, packages may be modified!** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

When the host attempts to download a software package for application deployment, this software package in CodeArts Artifact is updated. As a result, the SHA256 values in the file are inconsistent.

Solution

Deploy the application again and do not update the software package in CodeArts Artifact during application deployment.

4.2.6 Inconsistent MD5 Values in a File

Symptoms

During file download, the error message File MD5 different,packages may be modified! is displayed.

Cause Analysis

When the host attempts to download a software package for application deployment, this software package in CodeArts Artifact is updated. As a result, the MD5 values in the file are inconsistent.

Solution

Deploy the application again and do not update the software package in CodeArts Artifact during application deployment.

4.2.7 Error "More than 100 build files"

Symptoms

During file download, the error message More than 100 build files is displayed.

Cause Analysis

When **Build task** is selected for **Source**, if more than 100 software packages are generated by the build task, the download may time out.

Solution

The following workarounds are available:

- Retry the build task and compress the generated software packages into one.

When the native PowerShell command **Compress-Archive** or the action **Build** with **MSBuild** is used for packaging, the file path in the PowerShell command uses backslashes (\) as separators. This packaging mode has poor platform compatibility. As a result, the preceding problem occurs.

Solution

1. Run the following script to build a package:

nuget restore





Figure 4-70 Opening the Control Panel page







4.14.17 A Network Error Occurs During Software Installation on CentOS

Symptoms

- 2. Check the firewall configurations.
 - Run the iptables -nL command to check whether outbound access is restricted on port 80.
- 3. Check the outbound rules of the security group to which the target host belongs.
 - Contact the network administrator to modify the outbound rules of the security group.

4.14.18 A Network Error Occurs During Software Installation on Ubuntu OS

Symptoms

The error message time out is displayed when software is installed on Ubuntu OS.

Cause Analysis

- The target host failed to download the software package from the official image repository due to network connection timeout.
- The possible causes of network connection timeout are as follows:

- a. The network between the target host and the APT repository is disconnected
- b. The firewall restricts outbound access.
- c. The security group has an outbound rule to restrict access.

- 1. Run the **ping \$domainName** command to check the network connectivity. **\$domainName** indicates the domain name of the APT repository. If the network is normal, perform steps 2 and 3 to check the firewall and security group. If the network is abnormal, contact the network administrator.
- 2. Check the firewall configurations.

- 3. Check the outbound rules of the security group to which the target host belongs.
 - Contact the network administrator to modify the outbound rules of the security group.

4.14.19 Windows Path Not Allowed on a Linux Host

Symptoms

The following log information is displayed.

"msg": "Failed to find handler for \"usr/local/python/Python-3.5.4.tgz\". Make sure the required command to extract the file is installed. Command \"/usr/bin/unzip\" could not handle archive. Command \"/usr/bin/gtar\" could not handle archive."}

Cause Analysis

The installation path you entered for application deployment on a Linux host is a Windows path.

Solution

Enter a correct installation path.

4.14.20 Other FAQs

Service Started Normally But Exits Abnormally Upon Application Deployment Completion

Symptoms

After a command or script for starting a service is deployed, the service is started. However, the service exits unexpectedly when application deployment is complete.

Cause Analysis

The possible cause is that the service is started in synchronous mode, which means that the child process will also end when the parent process ends. As a

result, the session for starting the service is disconnected when application deployment is complete.

Solution

Run the following command to start the service in asynchronous mode:

nohup \${command} > \${log_file} 2>&1 &

In the preceding command, **\${command}** indicates the service startup command, and **\${log_file}** indicates service startup logs. If you do not want to export log files, use **/dev/null** instead.

Application Deployment Is Complete, But the Service Fails to Be Stopped

Symptoms

The result shows that the command or script for stopping a service has been deployed successfully, but the service fails to be stopped.

Cause Analysis

The possible cause is that the service is stopped in asynchronous mode. In this case, an error may be reported, or a message indicating that the deployment is complete is displayed even though the deployment is actually not complete.

Solution

Deploy the command for stopping a service in synchronous mode. If an error is reported, rectify the fault as prompted.

Timeout Caused by Continuous Application Deployment

Symptoms

After the deployment of the action **Run Shell Commands**, application deployment continues and causes a timeout.

Cause Analysis

- The deployment efficiency of commands in applications is low, so the deployment requires a long time.
- Interactive commands are contained in the script, and these commands require user inputs on the client.

Solution

- Manually run the commands in the application on the target host, and check whether the script deployment duration exceeds the timeout interval (30 minutes).
- Check whether interactive commands, such as read, sudo, su, and yum, are contained. If there are no interactive commands, you can manually run the script on the target host.

Command That Exists on the Target Host Fails to Be Found During Application Deployment

Symptoms

A command exists on the target host, but during application deployment, a message indicating that the command does not exist is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The installation directory corresponding to the command is not added to the environment variable file /etc/profile.

Solution

- Log in to the target host and run the following command to view the command installation directory: type \${command}
- 2. Modify the application. Specifically, use the absolute path to call the corresponding command, or add the command installation directory to the environment variable file /etc/profile of the target host.

Shell Script Deployment Is Complete, But Expected Result Is Not Achieved

Symptoms

Deployment of the shell script is complete, but it does not achieve the expected result.

Cause Analysis

The script fails to be executed.

Solution

During the deployment of the shell script, the script execution result is displayed. You can use the following two execution options provided by the shell script to facilitate fault locating:

- **set** –**e** option: The script execution exits upon the first command execution failure, and an error message is returned.
- **set** –**x** option: Debug information is generated for the execution of each command during script execution.

4.15 Running Shell Scripts

4.15.1 Running Shell Scripts Failed

Symptoms

The error message File or directory does not exist is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The path of the shell script is incorrect.

Solution

Check the path of the shell script and ensure that both the path and file name are correct.

4.15.2 Deployment Is Successful But Does Not Achieve the Expected Result

Symptoms

The action deployment is successful, but it does not achieve the expected result.

Cause Analysis

- The script is incorrectly compiled.
- The script contains the operation of starting a process, but is run in **common execution mode**.

Solution

Perform the following operations based on the failure causes:

- Check the script, and run the script on the local host first. After confirming that the script is correct, perform the deployment again.
- If the script contains the operation of starting a service or process, select **Background** for **Running Mode**.
- If the expected result is not achieved after the preceding operations are performed, for example, the deployment is successful, but the service is not started, perform the following steps:
 - The following uses the script for starting Tomcat as an example:
 - Add the shell command ps -ef|grep tomcat in the action Run Shell Commands and check whether the Tomcat process is started successfully.
 - ii. If no Tomcat process is found, check the startup failure log in the Tomcat log directory and analyze the cause.

4.15.3 Application Deployment Interruption

Symptoms

When a host-related application is deployed, an error message is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The /etc/ssh/sshd_config configuration file has defined the heartbeat time (unit: s) in ClientAliveInterval for interactions between the server and client. If the host does not respond within the time limit in an Ansible application, the SSH service will be disconnected.

- Change the value of ClientAliveInterval in the /etc/ssh/sshd_config file to 1800.
- 2. Restart the SSHD service.

4.15.4 Insufficient Permissions

Symptoms

When a host-related application is deployed, and the error message "insufficient permissions" is displayed, indicating that you do not have permissions to access the current file or folder.

Cause Analysis

You do not have permissions to access the current file or folder.

Solution

- Switch to other files that you have permissions to access.
- Use a user account with higher permissions, for example, root.
- Grant higher permissions to the user account you are using. For example, to grant all permissions to a user account, add 'user ALL=(ALL) ALL' to the /etc/sudoers file. user indicates the user to grant higher permissions to.

Symptoms

Solution

In the /etc/sudoers file, add \$username ALL=(ALL) NOPASSWD: ALL after root ALL=(ALL:ALL) ALL. \$username indicates a username.

When the PowerShell command **java -jar jenkins.war --httpPort=8088** is deployed, the progress is stuck in deploying state until timeout occurs. This problem always occurs when the PowerShell command is used for service startup.

Cause Analysis

The host waits for the deployment result after a PowerShell command is deployed. If the command is executed continuously, the deployment will time out. In this case, a message is displayed indicating that the deployment fails due to timeout.

Solution

Run the PowerShell command that is continuously executed in the background.

4.16.2 Unidentified PowerShell Commands Are Used

Symptoms

When the PowerShell command **docker version** is deployed on a host that does not have Docker installed, the deployment is successful, but the log shows that Docker is not installed.

Cause Analysis

The Windows host has an error correction mechanism when deploying the action **Run PowerShell Commands**. Therefore, the deployment will not fail. However, the log shows that no Docker service is available.

Solution

Install the Docker service on the host and run the PowerShell command again.

4.16.3 PowerShell Command References a File or Folder That Does Not Exist

Symptoms

During the deployment of the PowerShell command **cd C:/abcd/**, an error message is displayed.

Case 1: The error message **connect: permission denied** is displayed.

Case 2: An error message is displayed, indicating that the user does not have permissions to access /etc/docker/daemon.json:

Cause Analysis

Only the **root** user and users in the Docker user group are allowed to perform operations on Docker.

Solution

Step 1 Add the user to the Docker user group.

- 1. Log in to the server using a user account with the sudo permissions, for example, **testuser**.
- 2. Check whether the Docker user group exists. sudo cat /etc/group | grep docker
 - a. If so, add the user to the Docker user group. sudo usermod -aG docker testuser
 - If not, create a Docker user group and add the user to the group. sudo groupadd docker sudo usermod -aG docker testuser
- **Step 2** Exit the server. Then, log in to the server again and check whether the user can run the Docker command.

Step 3 If another error message, indicating that the user does not have permissions to access /var/run/docker.sock, is displayed, modify the permissions for /var/run/docker.sock.

sudo chmod a+rw /var/run/docker.sock

4.18.4 Image Does Not Exist

Symptoms

The error message **No such image** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The specified image does not exist on the local host.

Solution

Check whether the specified image is correct. If the image is incorrect, specify a correct one.

4.18.5 login Command Execution Failed

Symptom 1

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **login**, the error message **unauthorized**: **authentication required** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

Authentication fails due to incorrect username or password.

Solution

Enter the correct username and password.

Symptom 2

During the deployment of the **login** command in the action **Run Docker Command**, an error message indicating no permissions is displayed.

Cause Analysis

Only the **root** user and users in the Docker user group are allowed to perform operations on Docker.

Solution

Add the user to the Docker user group.

□ NOTE

For details about how to join a Docker group, see No Deployment Permissions.

Symptom 3

During the deployment of the **login** command in the action **Run Docker Command**, the error message **request canceled while waiting for connection(Client.Timeout exceeded while awaiting headers)** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

- 1. The image repository address is incorrect. As a result, the connection fails and Docker fails to verify the v2 interface.
- 2. The host does not have the permission to access external networks or is not configured with a proxy. As a result, the connection to the remote image repository times out.

Solution

- 1. Check the image repository address to ensure that the image repository address is correct and reachable.
- 2. Configure a proxy for the host to connect to the image repository.

Symptom 4

During the deployment of the **login** command in the action **Run Docker Command**, two error messages are displayed: **certificate signed by unknown authority** and **Task failed may be associated with not configured trust**.

Cause Analysis

No certificates have been configured for the image repository, and the target host has not been authorized to access this repository.

Solution

- Check that the image repository address, username, and password are correct, and that the network connection and user permissions are normal.
- During host authorization, Docker will be restarted and containers will be stopped. To prevent this from happening, configure the required image repository address in advance.

Case 1

No container is running, or the container is interrupted. The interruption does not affect services.

- 1. In the deployment action details area, set **Command** to **login** and select **Yes** for **Restart Docker**.
- 2. If you need to restart the containers, add the action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **restart** in the action details.
- 3. Click Save & Deploy.

Case 2

Containers are running, and a service interruption is not allowed.

- 1. Check whether the /etc/docker/daemon.json file exists.
 - a. If the file does not exist, create it and add the following configuration to the file:

Symptom 2

- During the deployment of the build command in the action Run Docker Command, the error message request canceled while waiting for connection and a FROM statement are displayed.
- During the deployment of the build command in the action Run Docker Command, an error message (not found) indicating that the base image is not found and a FROM statement are displayed.

Cause Analysis

The base image following the FROM statement in the Dockerfile does not exist in the local host or the remote repository. Another possible cause is that you have not logged in to the remote repository and cannot pull the base image from the remote repository.

Solution

When deploying the **build** command, ensure that you have logged in to the remote repository or have pulled the base image from the repository to the local host.

Symptom 3

During the deployment of the **build** command in the action **Run Docker Command**, an error message indicating that the command in the Dockerfile fails is displayed in the stderr log and the build command execution logs are also printed.

Cause Analysis

The information such as user information in the Dockerfile is incorrect, or the command is incorrectly run during the build process.

Solution

Modify the Dockerfile based on the log information to ensure that all information in the file is correct and the command can be deployed properly.

4.18.7 tag Command Execution Failed

Symptom 1

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **tag**, the error message **...requires exactly 2 arguments...** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The possible causes are as follows:

- Multiple groups of images are not separated by line breaks.
- The format of the image tag is incorrect.

Solution

Perform the following operations based on the failure causes:

- Separate multiple groups of images with line breaks.
- Modify the image tag format as prompted.

Symptom 2

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **tag**, the output indicates that the **tag** command is in the format of **docker tag SOURCE_IMAGE[:TAG] TARGET_IMAGE[:TAG]...** and that the execution parameters end with a line break.

Cause Analysis

One or more line breaks (\n) are mistakenly added to the end of the images to be tagged.

Solution

Delete the last line break in the text box for tagging multiple groups of images.

4.18.8 push Command Execution Failed

Symptom 1

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **push**, the error message **...An image does not exist locally with the tag...** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The image to be pushed does not exist on the local host.

Solution

Check that the entered image information is correct, and push the image again.

Symptom 2

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **push**, an error message is displayed, indicating that the authentication failed.

Cause Analysis

You have logged out of the remote image repository and cannot push images.

Solution

Run the **login** command to log in to the remote image repository and push the image again.

4.18.9 run Command Execution Failed

Symptom 1

When you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **run**, the operation does not stop until it fails.

Cause Analysis

The parameters set on the page are not specified to run in the background.

Solution

Add **-d** in the parameters to run the **run** command in the background.

Symptom 2

Cause Analysis

The local image does not exist.

Solution

Check that the image name and tag are correct, and run the image again.

4.18.10 start, restart, stop, or rm Command Execution Failed

Symptom 1

The container does not exist.

The container configuration is incorrect, or the configuration file is damaged.

Symptom 2

Cause Analysis

The image to be deleted has been running and a container has been created using this image. The image cannot be deleted before the container is deleted.

Solution

Stop and delete the container, and then delete the image.

4.18.12 pull Command Execution Failed

Cause Analysis

The container to be deleted is running.

- Add the -f parameter to forcibly delete a running container using SIGKILL.

4.18.14 Connection Timed Out

Symptom 1

Cause Analysis

The image to be pulled is not tagged with the repository address, repository branch, or username, or the tag information is incorrect.

Solution

Enter a correct and complete image name, and try to pull the image again.

Symptom 2

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **push**, the error message **request canceled while waiting for connection** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The image to be pushed is not tagged with the repository address, repository branch, or username, or the tag information is incorrect.

Solution

Run the **tag** command to tag the correct repository branch information for the image to be pushed, and try to push the image again.

Symptom 3

After you add the deployment action **Run Docker Command** and set **Command** to **login**, the error message **request canceled while waiting for connection(Client.Timeout exceeded while awaiting headers)** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

- 1. The image repository address is incorrect. As a result, the connection fails and Docker fails to verify the v2 interface.
- 2. The host does not have the permission to access external networks or is not configured with a proxy. As a result, the connection to the remote image repository times out.

Solution

- Check the image repository address to ensure that it is correct and reachable.
- 2. Configure a proxy for the host to connect to the image repository.

4.18.15 Application Deployment Interruption

Symptoms

4.21.2 Target File Does Not Exist in CodeArts Artifact

Symptoms

An error message similar to **ReleaseManFileUrl is null,Please check the deploy task!** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The Manifest file selected in an application does not exist in CodeArts Artifact.

Solution

Edit the application and select the required Manifest file again.

Log keyword: ReleaseManFileUrl is null

4.21.3 Path of the Manifest File in CodeArts Artifact Is Incorrect

Symptoms

An error message similar to Failed to download k8s files from ReleaseService, please check your file path! is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The Manifest file selected in an application does not exist in CodeArts Artifact.

When editing the application, check whether the YML file path is correct. If the application parameters are referenced, ensure that the final path is correct after the parameters are replaced.

Log keyword: Failed to download k8s files from ReleaseService

4.21.4 kubeconfig File Is Incorrectly Configured

Symptoms

An error log such as **Unable to connect to the server** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The kubeconfig file is incorrectly configured. As a result, the cluster fails to be connected to.

Solution

- Any error in the configuration of the kubeconfig file may cause a cluster connection failure.
- Ensure that the used kuebconfig file is correct. For details about how to generate the kubeconfig file, see **Kubernetes Deployment Guide**.

Log keyword: Unable to connect to the server

4.21.5 kubectl Command Fails to Be Deployed

Symptoms

An error is reported in the **TASK [Execute kubectl command]** step. The **stderr_lines** field starts with **error** and is followed by the error information.

Cause Analysis

The kubectl command that is used to perform operations on clusters fails to be deployed.

Solution

- 1. Check whether the value of the **cmd** field in the log is the same as expected.
- 2. If not, modify the application.
- 3. If the command is correct, check the information in the **stderr_lines** field and rectify the fault according to the error information.

NOTICE

The selected Manifest file and path are encrypted. Therefore, they are different from the original values.

4.21.6 Failed to Deploy Applications on Kubernetes

Symptoms

The error message Failed to download k8s files from CodeArts Repo, please check your file path! is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The size of the selected code repository file exceeds 200 MB, or the number of files in the code repository exceeds 1,024.

Solution

Split the code repository to ensure that the Manifest code repository contains only the Manifest configuration of Kubernetes.

4.21.7 Log Contains "Too many files to unzip" When CodeArts Repo Is Selected as the Manifest File Source During Kubernetes Deployment

Symptoms

During the deployment of the action **Deploy on Kubernetes**, when **Use Manifest files** is selected and **CodeArts Repo** is selected for **File Source**, the error message **Too many files to unzip.** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

In the current application, there are more than 1024 files in the selected branch of the code repository.

Solution

Method 1:

Create a branch for the Manifest file. Then edit the application, select this branch, save the settings, and perform the deployment again.

Method 2:

4.21.8 Error Message "File is too large" Displayed During Manifest File Source Selection for Kubernetes Deployment

Symptoms



Usage of Copy and Template Modules

You are not allowed to copy folders if the copy and template modules are used in playbooks. Instead, you must copy the files to the directory where the .yml script is located, set the source directory (**src**) to the name of the files to be copied, and set the destination directory (**dest**) to the file path on the target host.

- name: Copy a version of named.conf that is dependent on the OS. setype obtained by doing ls -Z /etc/named.conf on original file template:

src: named.conf_{{ ansible_os_family}}.j2
dest: /etc/named.conf

NOTICE

If the file name contains only digits (for example, **123654**), enclose the file name with single quotation marks (') or double quotation marks ("), for example, **'123654'**.

4.22.4 JSON Parameter Parsing Error

Symptoms

JSON parameters are not replaced or parsed as expected during the Ansible application deployment.

During the Ansible application deployment, the template module can be used to replace a text file. If the parameter values in the file are in JSON or JSON array format, the character **u** will be added in front of the keys and values after parsing. For example:

- Input parameters: {"key":"jsonkey","value":"jsonvalue"}
- Parameters after replacement: {u'value': u'jsonvalue', u'key': u'jsonkey'}

Solution

Enclose JSON parameters with single quotation marks. The template module will forcibly parse the parameters in character string mode to ensure correct replacement. The following is an example:

- Input parameters: {"key":"jsonkey","value":"jsonvalue"}
- Parameters after replacement: {"key":"jsonkey","value":"jsonvalue"}

4.22.5 Service Module in Playbook Scripts Fails to Start or Stop Services

Symptoms

The service module in playbook scripts cannot start or stop services.

Cause Analysis

The service module uses the **started** and **stopped** parameters to control services. Deployment is supported only when specific conditions are met. For details, see service description in the Ansible official document.

Use the shell or command module to deploy the **service xxx start/stop** command to start or stop a service. **xxx** indicates a service name.

4.22.6 Ansible Application Deployment Fails

Symptoms

The deployment action **Ansible** fails and the error message **Download file error** is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The downloaded playbook package is too large, or there are more than 1024 files in the package.

Solution

The Ansible file cannot contain the **local_action** command.

Delete the IP address or host name of the local host from the **delegate_to** syntax.

- If there are multiple IP addresses or host names, delete the local IP address and host name and retain others.
- If there is only the IP address or host name of the local host, delete the entire line of **delegate_to** syntax.

4.22.8 Application Deployment Interruption

Symptoms

When a host-related application is deployed, an error message is displayed.

Cause Analysis

The /etc/ssh/sshd_config configuration file has defined the heartbeat time (unit: s) in ClientAliveInterval for interactions between the server and client. If the host does not respond within the time limit in an Ansible application, the SSH service will be disconnected.

- Change the value of ClientAliveInterval in the /etc/ssh/sshd_config file to 1800.
- 2. Restart the SSHD service.





Figure 4-135 Selecting installation type





Figure 4-136 Selecting destination server




Figure 4-137 Finding Web Server(IIS)




